

SNEWGA Representative Responsibilities

1. Encourage and recruit individual membership in SNEWGA, as well as participation in SNEWGA events; collect and submit membership dues, and distribute membership cards and directories.
2. Attend, with your club president or her delegate (if possible), the two annual SNEWGA meetings. These are traditionally held in the Spring and Fall on Saturday. Details will be posted on the SNEWGA web site as each event is planned.
3. Post, remove and file SNEWGA tournament invitations and newsletters.
4. Review all SNEWGA tournament descriptions. This is so you are familiar with the different formats, can pass that along to your fellow club members, and can recruit for those tournaments as needed.
5. Field teams and schedule play for the Spring Cup (formerly Round Robin), which starts early May, and for the Fall Cup matches, which are held in September. Details will be posted on SNEWGA web site as each event is planned.
6. Field teams equitably for SNEWGA Team Championship (Team Day), Pro Lady, and Memorial tournaments.
7. Work with the tournament committee to eliminate conflicts between club and SNEWGA major events (example: your club's Club Championship should not be scheduled in conflict with the Connecticut State Amateur, SNEWGA Team Championship (Team Day), Pro Lady, SNEWGA Championship tournaments, or Memorial tournaments.)
8. Act as liaison between SNEWGA and your club in such matters as course rating (when appropriate).
9. Ensure your club meets SNEWGA member club requirements for tournament hosting. Member clubs must host either a major tournament or an invitational at least every other year. The SNEWGA Rep, with help from SNEWGA's Tournament Chairperson, is responsible for making sure her club is in compliance with this regulation.
10. Contact your regional delegate (listed on this web site on the "Member Club List" or "Contact the Board" pages) if you have any questions, need help or further information.
11. Prepare for succession planning. It is your responsibility (with the input of your club president or club board) to identify someone to take your place when you decide not to continue as SNEWGA Rep for your club.
